

# Grow Lists for Syllable Rules

#### **Double Consonants**

A word containing two consonants between two vowels (VCCV) is divided between the two consonants.

cor-rect pret-ty sis-ter

### **Compound Words**

Divide compound words between the two original words.

tooth-brush back-pack pop-corn

#### Single Consonant between Two Vowels (VCV)

In a two syllable word containing a single consonant between two vowels, the consonant usually begins the second syllable.

to-day be-ret a-wake

#### **Divide Off Prefixes and Suffixes**

*re*-wind *un-hap*-py *care*-ful

#### Words that End in "LE"

In a word ending in **-le**, the consonant immediately preceding the **-le** usually begins the last syllable.

can-dle mar-ble ta-ble

#### **Closed-Open Syllables**

**Closed syllables** are syllables that end with a consonant sound. Most closed syllables have a short vowel sound.

*jump*-ing *check*-er *soc*-cer

**Open syllables** are syllables that end with a vowel. Most open syllables have a long vowel sound.

*hope*-ful *home*-land *fore*-see


