What is Class-wide Peer Tutoring?

CWPT is a peer-assisted instructional strategy designed to be integrated with any K-12 curricula. Students will increase language skills and recall of targeted content by asking questions and receiving

immediate feedback from a peer tutor. Students help each other to reinforce concepts and skills initially taught by the teacher, and students love it.

How Can CWPT Be Used?

CWPT can be used for language, math, science, social studies, and any content plus reading. It can be used in regular classrooms, as a response to intervention (RTI), in special education classrooms, after-school programs, and standardized test prep efforts.

How Does CWPT Save Time & Reduce Stress?

First, the students are doing the learning and teaching in a way that dramatically speeds up mastery. Their brains "get it" faster. Second, CWPT reduces the need for much remedial

teaching. Third, the teacher does not have to provide as much immediate feedback.

How Much Time Does CWPT Need?

Prep takes approximately 20-30 minutes per subject per week, which can be shared by grade teams or other teachers or even volunteers. You don't have papers to grade so you'll be able to use more time for higher-order lessons.

Best practice involves using CWPT 3-4 times per week (15-25 mins.), with a pre-test/post-test on the same day. You can draw content from any source, to use with special forms.
